The Devil's Bridge in the Schöllenen

The Gotthard Pass in Switzerland is the shortest connection between central Germany and Italy. But the Schöllenen Gorge near Andermatt in the canton of Uri was impassable until a blacksmith of the Goeschenen village built the "Twärrenbrücke", a suspended bridge along a steep rockface in the 13th century. This opened the new pass route and the economic growth coming from traffic circulation lead to a new political status of the adjacent districts: it was the birth of Switzerland as a confederation of states.
